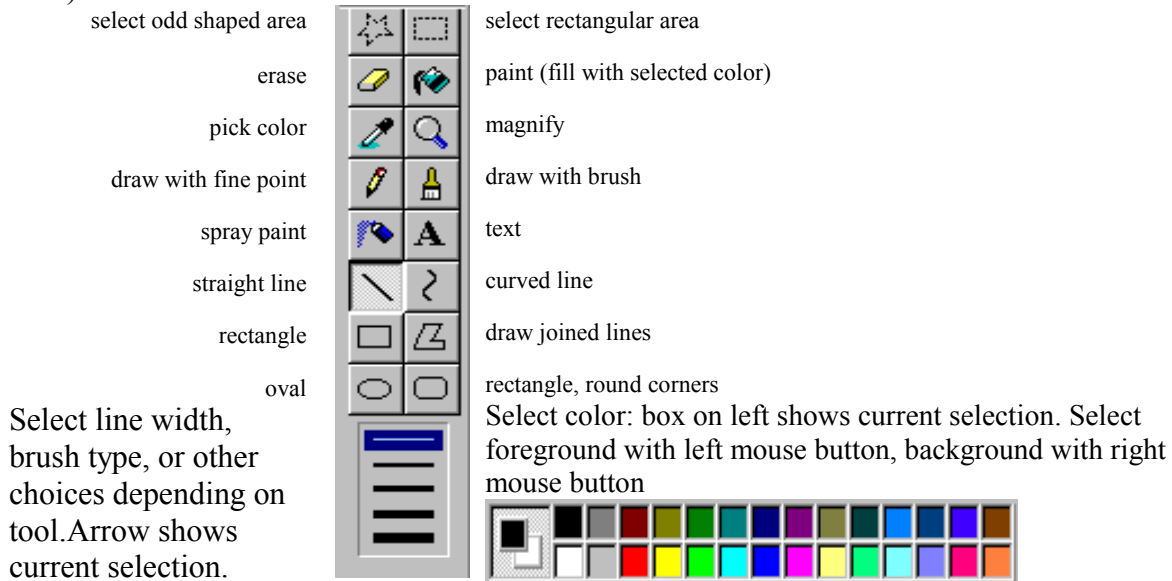


Using Windows Paint Program

When you start the Paint Program, you will see the following windows: The toolbox is on the left. The palette is on the bottom. The palette has a larger box on the left that shows the selected color. (The foreground is on top, background underneath.). The drawing width selection appears below the toolbox for some tools. The current selection is highlighted it. The drawing area is in the middle. (Select **H**elp for an explanation of each tool.)



Example: To create a picture of a house: Drag the drawing area to the size you want.

Draw the House: Click once on the rectangle tool to select it. Press down the left mouse button at one corner of the house and drag the mouse to the opposite corner of the house and release to draw a rectangle. Repeat to draw the windows and doors.

Draw the Roof & Chimney: You need lines for the roof, and the chimney. Select the line tool. Press down the left mouse button at end of the line, drag the mouse to the other end and release to draw a line. Repeat to draw all five lines.

Paint the Door Red: Select red from the palette. Click on the paint bucket to select it, then click once in the middle of the door. Paint the chimney, house, and windows any color you like. If you make a mistake, select **E**dit, **U**ndo. (*It undoes everything since you last selected a tool or color.*)

The Tree: Select the spray paint tool. Press the mouse button like it was a can of spray paint to make the leaves. The Trunk: select the curved line tool. Drag a line, then click along the side of the trunk to make the line stretch and curve. The “spray paint” is also used for the smoke.

Edit: You can move parts of the drawing by outlining the area with one of the scissors tools. Move the selected area by *dragging*, or by using the copy **CTRL**+**C**, cut **CTRL**+**V** and paste **CTRL**+**V** functions.

Save the File: Select **F**ile, **S**ave, name it A:\HOUSE.BMP
